Insisting on Accountability

Accountability at all levels was one of the themes included at the last convention.

The goal is simple, at all levels of our union there must be accountability. Union leaders must be held accountable by the members and be guided by the constitution and the local union's bylaws.

While elections sort out accountability from the members, we need accountability by the international and from the international as it relates to a local union's operation and governance.

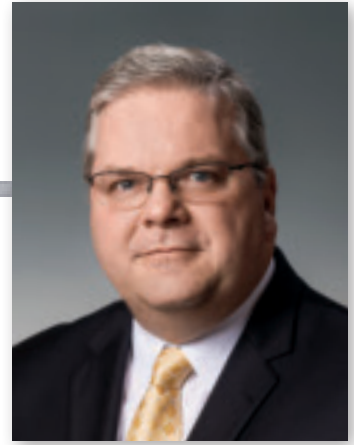
In the past, the international identified the best practices by local unions for operational efficiency known as KPIs or Key Performance Indicators. The KPIs were used as guiding principles to fulfill our commitment to organize the industry, train our members, enforce the collective bargaining agreement and meet the demand of the unionized industry.

Once these assessments were completed annually, the strengths and weakness were relayed to the locals and plans for improvement were made with the district council presidents and the locals. While plans were made, many locals struggled to survive during the post-2008 construction depression.

Like all plans, they often need to be revisited and reshaped. Work has returned at a rapid pace and the general executive council (GEC) has decided to revisit the strategy. Since the last convention, the GEC has met to sharpen the focus of the KPIs and insist we no longer simply assess and identify weakness, but demand improvements in areas of deficiency. As an example, locals with low amounts of certified welders fail to control the market share in their local

areas. Do we justify our inability to man the work or look at the cause?

Many times when we see a deficiency in certified welders, the local typically does not have an accredited welding program certified by the apprenticeship and training department through the Ironworker Apprenticeship Certification Program (IACP). Often times, locals lack internal certified welding inspectors. In this case, we have locals

not sending candidates to our internal training held annually, the local not investing in its welding facility to be compliant, the members and contractors suffering from a limited pool of welders, in turn costing us work opportunities, which results in a loss of wages, pension and welfare contributions and members.

That's just one example. I will spend the next several months identifying the international's efforts to insist on accountability.

The graph illustrates the interdependent strategy leading to success by locals on behalf of you, the member, and your local. Any local failing in various areas fails the members—and bad things happen—resulting in a loss of market share. We must and can do better.

BE THAT ONE GUY:

IRON WORKERS LEADING THE INDUSTRY IN DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION



In 2018, the Iron Workers (IW) are leading the industry in diversity and inclusion with the Be That One Guy campaign. Featured on the cover of this month's issue of *The Ironworker* is Lisa Kientzy, a fourth-year apprentice with Local 396 (St. Louis). She understands the increasing number of women working in the trades is

transforming the tone of the workplace. "Women on the jobsite are changing the dynamic of the job," Kientzy says. "So why should they be treated any differently when working side by side with their male co-workers?"

The typical scenario that leads to harassment, bullying or intimidation begins with someone on

the jobsite teasing, touching and threatening and/or being demeaning and demanding. The worker being harassed knows their job (and reputation) is at risk if they speak up and they lack the power or authority to stop the harassment from happening. That's where Be That One Guy comes into play. Women in the trades want you to

Be That One Guy who isn't afraid to speak up and tell the bully to knock it off. That one guy who isn't afraid to back up a woman or any other worker when they seek help from a co-worker, foreman, general foreman, superintendent or management.

That one guy knows every worker deserves the same respect

as he does. Kientzy tells us, "Our brothers are vital to what we're doing. We come in and some guys think we can't do it, but others are encouraging. We need that. We need that support to know we have someone on our side."

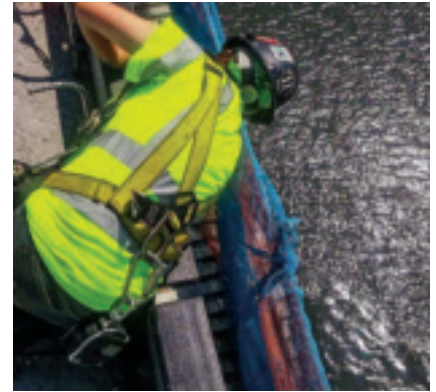

the workplace. Help from co-workers on the job is essential to ending workplace harassment.

The IW’s Be That One Guy initiative draws attention to the role of female ironworkers and the unique challenges they face on the jobsite, but the campaign isn’t just for women. Harassment and intimidation can happen to anyone. The concept behind Be That One Guy is that all workers deserve respect. Sister ironworker and chair of North America’s Building Trades Union Women’s Committee, Vicki O’Leary, is a driving force behind the campaign. O’Leary believes the initiative embodies the idea that one ironworker can make it better for everyone on the jobsite. “We know our brothers are protective when another trade is bullying one of our own. The real issue is when the harasser is a fellow ironworker and 33 years in this trade has taught me you don’t have to be the hero to make a difference,” says O’Leary.

“Calling a brother ironworker out is one option for stopping harassment, but it isn’t the only one,” O’Leary says. “Step in and ask a question or redirect the conversation. Deflect the situation somehow, don’t step aside and let it happen.” The campaign isn’t focused on lecturing male ironworkers but commending IW tradespeople for

being some of the most inclusive and professional in the business.

Many IW members already are that one guy. They understand harassment, bullying and intimidation have no place at the jobsite. One of those ironworkers is Joe “Icepick” Moore. Moore, who has been an ironworker at Local 433 (Los Angeles) for nearly two decades, says he’s not going to stand for harassment on the jobsite, “I’m not going to put up with it, I’m going to say something.”

“See something! Say something!” The safety mantra applies to harassment too.

The IW is focused on safety. Most of the IW membership recognizes harassment as a safety concern. Whether you’re the aggressor, a witness or the victim—if there is harassment and bullying on the jobsite, your focus isn’t where it should be: on the work. That’s when mistakes and accidents happen. Harassment puts every worker on a jobsite at risk.

Kathleen Dobson is a safety director with Alberici Constructors, and from her vantage point the initiative is essential for progression within the building trades. Be That One Guy, who gives a woman a chance, who gives her the opportunity to prove herself as a foreman or a supervisor. Dobson says, “When women are successful within the ironworking industry, it’s going to show other women that it is a viable option for them to get into productive, higher paying, better positions.” Dobson urges workers on the jobsite to personalize the issue, “Think about how you would feel if someone was talking like that to your own daughter.”

The Be That One Guy campaign debuted at the 2017 Iron Workers/IMPACT conference. The initiative urges everyone to make a conscious choice to take the high road no matter who the aggressor is. It challenges ironworkers to be better. Be respectful. Be aware. Be able to say, “I AM That One Guy.”

Tradeswomen and their allies, with support of their unions and industry leaders, are transforming the workplace. Help from co-workers on the job is essential to ending workplace harassment.

BUILDING A VETERANS' MOVEMENT IN LABOR



Will Attig

My name is Will Attig and I am the executive director of the Union Veterans Council (UVC). I am a proud journeyman pipefitter from southern Illinois and a decorated combat infantry veteran. UVC is building a platform and a voice for working class veterans.

It's a fast-growing organization, the foundation is built, and it is time to "hang some iron." Now's the time to join the 45,000 union veterans across the country who are organizing in your community.

What's a pipefitter like me doing in this magazine? Like so many other young men and women at the age of 18, I joined the United States Army to fight for a country I love. I was part of 1-26 Infantry, and we saw combat in some of the worst corners of Iraq. I grew to have a lot of pride in what I did. Being a soldier gave me dignity, something I never really experienced coming from a poor family in the Midwest. My unit was one of the most highly decorated battalions in the war, but also the battalion that had the most casualties since Vietnam. So not only did I have dignity, I had a brotherhood, men and women that always had my back – and I theirs.

That all abruptly ended when I retired from the service. I came home to Illinois in 2009 with no job, no degree and, what I believed, was no future. This is the same story hundreds of thousands of other veterans across this nation can tell you as well. I found myself in debt bouncing from one job to another, until my union gave me an opportunity.

I was accepted into a Helmets to Hardhats welding program and then completed a five-year apprenticeship program with my UA home local. This opportunity wasn't just another job. It was an opportunity to regain my dignity and also build a new brotherhood of union brothers and sisters. From that day forward, I dedicated my life to helping fellow veterans achieve the American dream they served to protect. This is what led me to the Union Veterans Council.

There are over 1 million veterans working today as union members, many are proud card-carrying ironworkers. The reality is the story of the American worker and the American veteran are one and the same. We are under attack, and it is time to take a stand, especially during a time when lawmakers are calling for right-to-work laws to be put into place. Right to work will undoubtedly weaken protections for working veterans. Attacks on prevailing wage laws and cuts to safety standards also hurt veterans. This means that when we see attacks on workers, veterans are affected—and our voice will be heard.

The council is building a network of chapters at the local labor body level to engage, educate and mobilize our veteran community. Chapters are growing in 15 cities, with more to come. Working-class veterans lack a credible voice and it is time labor leads the way in giving our voice back. That is why we are building local chapters, so our local veterans can have the tools and a platform to make their collective voice heard.

In the construction trades we know all too well you cannot build a powerhouse or a bridge on your own, it takes a team. We need your help and support.

Sign-up with us today if you are a veteran; it is free and only takes a few minutes. If you know or work with a union veteran, tell them about our organization and help them sign-up. If you are a leader who has veterans in your local, ask them to sign-up and then ask your local AFL-CIO organization if there are plans of starting a chapter in your area.

Untangling Free Trade

You can't find a more controversial issue than foreign trade. I knocked on doors in Dayton, Ohio, during the 2016 U.S. presidential election, and everyone I spoke to talked about the local factory that moved to Mexico thanks to the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). Needless to say, my Clinton pamphlets weren't too popular.

Don't get me wrong. Buying and selling goods across national borders makes both nations richer. But so-called free trade deals are often more about fleecing workers than freeing up trade.

Nobel prize-winning economist Paul Krugman said, "The fact is that at this point trade is fairly free." Free trade pushers like to cherry-pick odd tariffs, or taxes on imports, that are high on particular goods, but in general tariffs are as low as they've ever been. Free trade agreements like NAFTA and TPP do more to overrule laws protecting workers than they do to lower tariffs.

These deals don't create an equal playing field between workers in different countries. Dictatorships like China slash wages, cut corners on safety and the environment, and bust unions. Multinational corporations are happy to offshore their factories and pocket the difference in profits.

Ironworkers have felt the effects. Shop membership has dropped from about 30 percent of our

union to about 10, largely thanks to fabrication going overseas.

Bad trade policy in the states is bipartisan. Bill Clinton is the biggest Democratic offender, signing NAFTA and giving China Most Favored Nation status on trade. Republican George W. Bush oversaw a massive collapse in American manufacturing and tried to extend NAFTA to cover Central and South America. Barack Obama pushed the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), a NAFTA-like deal with Asian countries. We fought back and beat both Bush and Obama.

NAFTA cost workers many jobs in manufacturing. Over 20 years in, cross-border supply chains have become so closely linked that scrapping NAFTA would cause job loss all over again. Car parts cross back and forth between Michigan and Ontario on their way to assembly in union plants on both sides of the border. We're looking to improve NAFTA, rather than throw out the whole agreement.

Canada, which relies on exporting raw materials like oil and lumber, benefits more from TPP than the United States and is still in the negotiations. Canadian workers also have a lot riding on the temporary worker provisions of trade agreements. Our priorities in Canada include cutting the red tape for ironworkers traveling between Canada and the United States for work and preventing companies from abusing guest worker programs.

President Donald Trump is taking a fresh look at American trade policy. He slapped tariffs on steel, aluminum and other products. He reopened negotiations on NAFTA. Rethinking the U.S. approach to trade is long overdue; we just need to make sure Canadian ironworkers aren't caught in the crossfire.

What we really need to see, in both countries, is an approach to trade that goes beyond international agreements. We need national industrial policies to really help domestic manufacturing. If we can't make goods and get them to market, tariffs don't matter.

Columbus, Ohio, met the challenge of NAFTA outsourcing with a successful industrial policy. City government sat down with business and sketched

out a plan, raising taxes to pay for training, education and infrastructure. This turned out to be more valuable to business than cheap foreign labor, and Columbus now leads the state in job growth.

Alberta oil needs to reach the coast to be traded overseas, so Canada needs more pipelines. Anti-development interest groups killed the Energy East pipeline to the North Atlantic, delayed the Keystone XL pipeline to the Gulf of Mexico, and are fighting our efforts to approve a pipeline from Alberta to the Pacific Ocean. We've seen bipartisan support from Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's federal Liberals and Alberta Premier Rachel Notley's New Democratic Party.

President Trump's tariffs are a good start but will only succeed if America takes a page from Columbus' book. Building roads, expanding ports and strengthening apprenticeships are better ways to encourage trade than slashing protections with bad trade deals. Our focus is on the future, and if we manage trade right Canada and the U.S. will remain nations of builders.

WTC MEMORIAL

DONATED BY LOCAL 14 (SPOKANE, WASH.)

In Kennewick, Washington, stands a 35-foot-tall remnant from the twin towers as a memorial monument in the Southridge area. The artifact, weighing nearly 6,000 pounds, was obtained by the city from the Port Authority of New York & New Jersey. Three steel beams once were part of the World Trade Center were brought from the Lampson International shops in Kennewick to just north of the Southridge Sports Complex and placed on a specially prepared site near Highway 395 and Hildebrand Boulevard in Kennewick. The memorial site is about 40-by-40 feet and features two columns of basalt to symbolize the New York City towers. There are benches placed around the square where the monument and flagpole will be set. The site also has low landscaping, decorative rock and lights to illuminate the beams.

The purpose of the Ironworkers' Standards of Excellence is to reinforce the pride of every Ironworker and our commitment to be the most skilled, most productive and safest craft in the Building Trades.

As Union Ironworkers, we pledge ourselves to uphold our word, as given through our Collective Bargaining Agreement, and display the professionalism expected of our trade and Union in all aspects of our employment as exemplified by the values ingrained in our Standards of Excellence.

It is our commitment to use our training and skills, each and every day, to produce the highest quality work worthy of our name and consistent with the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

As an Ironworker member, I agree to:

1. Adhere to my responsibilities under the Collective Bargaining Agreement for start and quit times, as well as lunch and break times.
2. Allow my Representative to handle any disagreements or breaches by refusing to engage in unlawful job disruptions, slowdowns or any activities that affect our good name.
3. Respect the Customer's and Employer's rights, property and tools as I do my own.
4. Meet my responsibility to show up every day; outfitted for work and fit for duty without engaging in substance abuse.
5. Cooperate with the Customer and Employer to meet their statutory, regulatory and contractual responsibilities to maintain a safe, healthy and sanitary workplace.
6. Do my best to work in a manner consistent with the quality, productivity and safety of every task that I am assigned.
7. Do my best to help every co-worker return home safe at the conclusion of every shift.

The Ironworkers' Standards of Excellence will increase the pride, the productivity and the craftsmanship of every Ironworker throughout North America. This commitment will improve work place conditions, increase work opportunities, and help maintain our wages, benefits and standard of living. In addition, the Standards of Excellence will help our signatory employers complete their projects on time, on budget with no injuries or accidents.

In accordance with Article XXVI, Section 15 of the International Constitution, charges may be preferred against any member for violations of the Ironworkers' Standards of Excellence, including, but not limited to the following reasons:

- Taking a job referral and not reporting to work,
- Failing pre-employment qualifications,
- and/or Discharged for excessive absenteeism.

Fines for the first offense shall be no less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or no more than one (1) day's pay including fringe benefits and working assessments of eight (8) hours.

Members having been found guilty of a second offense, fines shall be no less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or no more than one (1) week's pay including fringe benefits and working assessments of forty (40) hours.

Members having been found guilty of a third offense, fines shall be no less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and no more than two (2) week's pay including fringe benefits and working assessments of eighty (80) hours.

Any member found guilty of the aforementioned violations three (3) times within a three (3) year period may also be expelled from the Local Union subject to the approval of the General Executive Board.

I acknowledge this responsibility and pledge my word to do the same.
