



Specifically, what part of pre-qualification adds to your cost? (select all that apply)



What is it?

- Online contractor management database companies that helps owner clients select contractors that meet regulatory and internal requirements
- Owners are relying on these services to select a higher quality contractor
- Major Players:
- ISNetworld
 - Started in 2001
 - 650 owners / 75K contractors
- Avetta [formerly PICS, BROWZ]
 - Started in 2003(330 owners / 55K contractors)
- Veriforce [formerly PEC]
 - Started in 2001
 - (225 owners / 11K contractors)

Increase your market share

Don't step back – step forward!

HOW TO GET SETUP Who do you want to work for & how to do it

Talk to clients / review major proposals / review prequal companies websites

Pay the fee and input data in the system

Contact prequal company to get account setup

Once you get your score, make changes as needed to raise your score. Continually monitor score.

Think this can be done overnight

Connect with Owners you're not working for

Put policies/procedures into systems that are not in use at your company

DON'Ts


Overstate your type of work





- State-of-the-art weld processing



Comments:

- Very easy breathing
- Light weight hard hat/welding combo
- Safety glasses do not fog at all
- Better spatial awareness with wide viewing area
- Transition from welding to grinding much easier/faster
- Protective lenses last much longer and stay cleaner
- Easy donning/doffing

- Viewing area, colour and clarity very clear, ADF lens met needs




